

Rules for Making a **MONOGRAM**

Individual Monograms

For those who want their own initials.



SINGLE INITIAL

Used to represent first or last name.
(i.e. Mary Smith or Georgia Murano)



FULL INITIALS

Represents one's entire name.
(i.e. Samuel Micah Hollis)



INITIALS CENTERED

Last name is enlarged and placed
between the first and middle initials.
(i.e. Claire Ann Zimmerman)

Couples Monograms

For those who want to share each other's initials.

(Example: Ellen Theal and Keith Luis)



SINGLE INITIAL

Used to represent the husband's last
name.
(Married Last)



INITIALS CENTERED

Center the husband's last name with the
couple's first initials.
(Wife's Name, Married Last, Husband's Name)

Independent Couples Monograms

For the wife who wants her maiden name.

(Example: Rachel Perry and Adam Quinn)



SINGLE INITIAL

Used to represent first or last name.
(Married Last)



FULL INITIALS

Represents wife's name with her
maiden and last name.
(First, Maiden, Married Last)



INITIALS CENTERED

Last name is enlarged and placed
between the first and middle initials.
(First, Married Last, Maiden)

Two Word Monograms

For those who happen to have two words for their last name.

(Example: Brian Edward Von Oss)



THREE INITIALS

When you want to include your
initials and leave out your middle.
(First, Last Two Names)



LAST INITIALS

Leaving just your last name.
(Last Two Names)

One Word Monograms

For those who have O' / Mac / Mc last names.

(Example: Abby Lane McNeil)



FULL INITIAL

Including all of your name.
(First, Middle, Last)



INITIALS CENTERED

Placing your enlarged last name
between your first and middle.
(First, Last, Middle)



INITIALS CENTERED

Just the preposition.
(Preposition)
