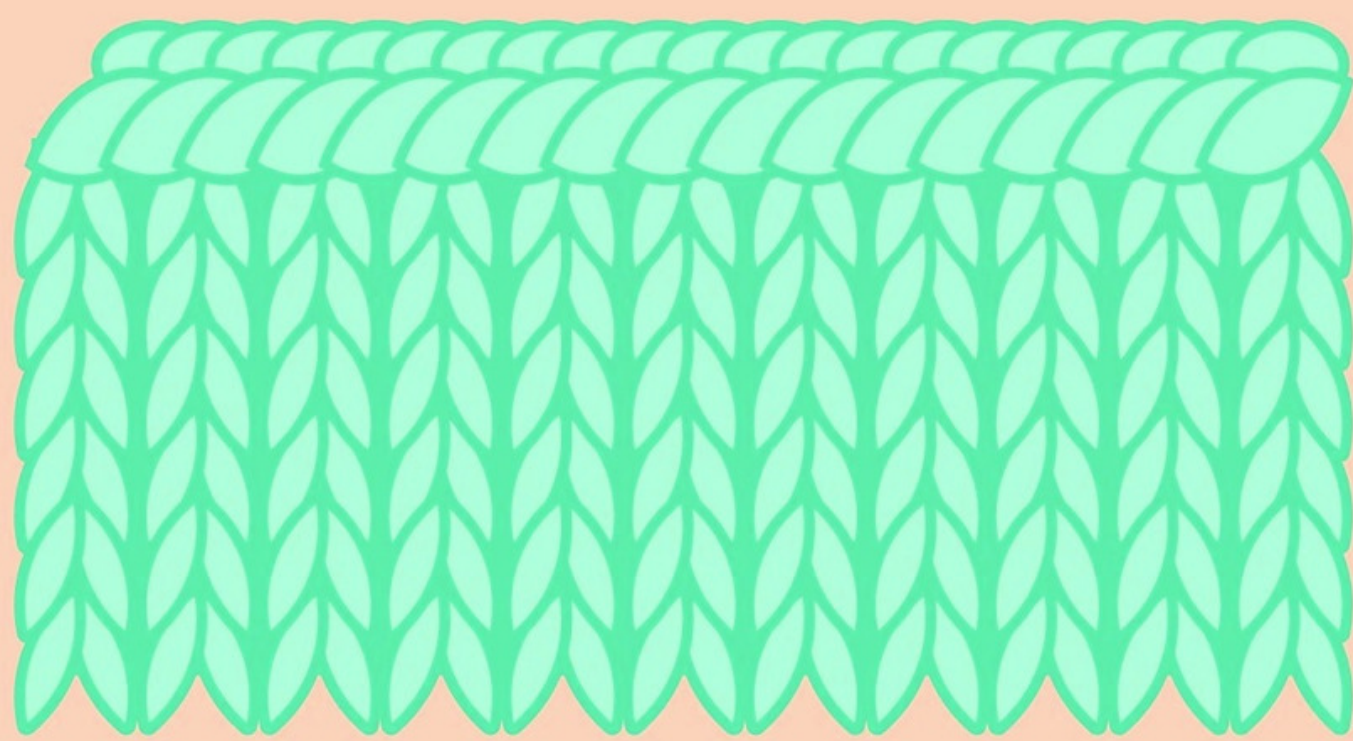


Knitting Cast-Ons & Bind-Offs Demystified

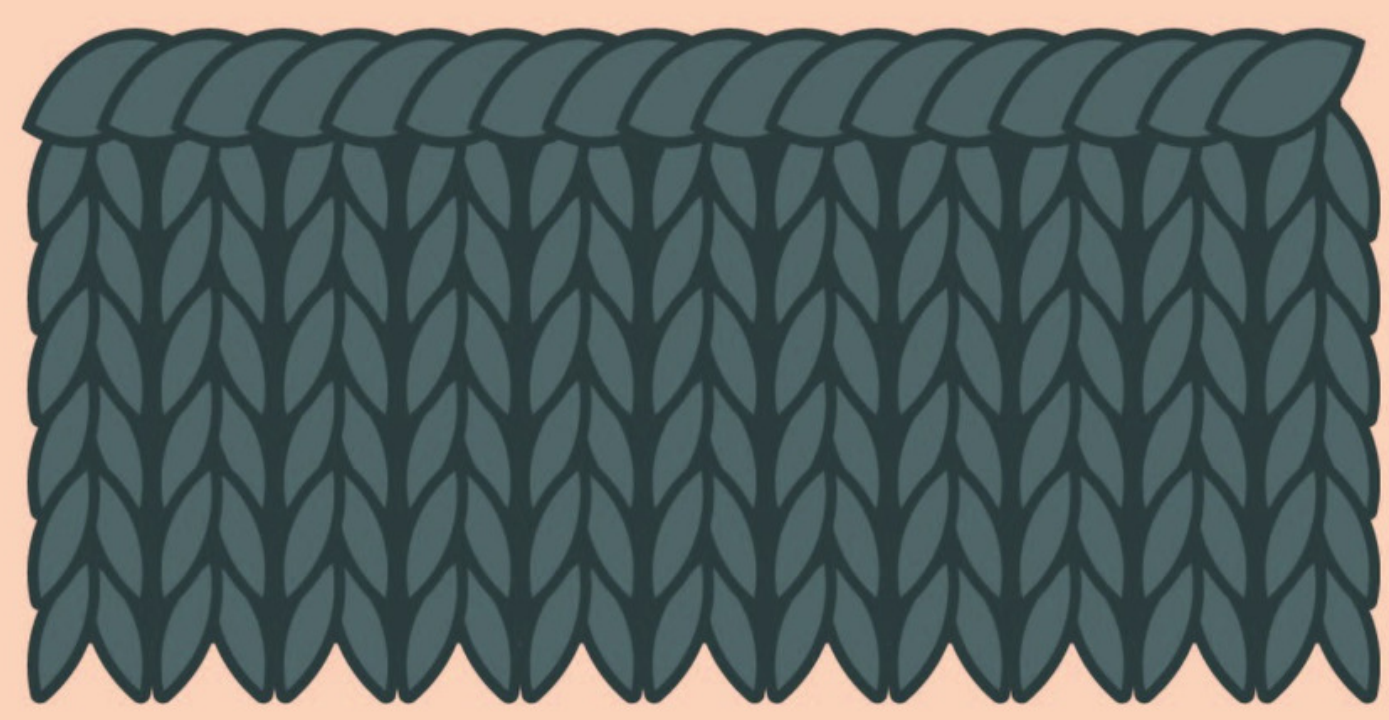


Standard Bind-Off

Most used bind-off.

Don't pull your stitches too tight!

Works with any knit-purl stitch pattern.

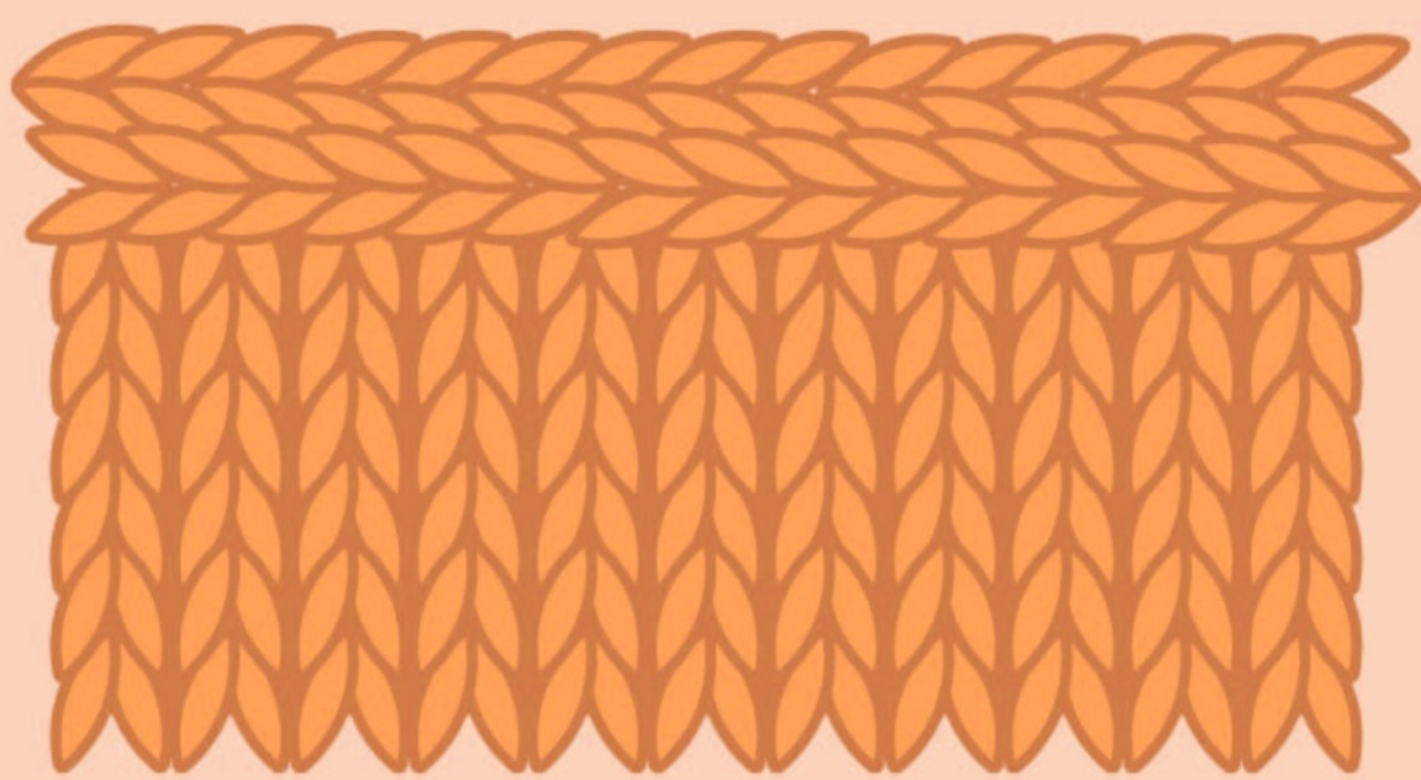


Knitted Cast-On

Easy to work—it's similar to a regular knit stitch.

Great for adding stitches to beginning or middle of a row.

Slightly stretchier than the Long-Tail Cast-On.

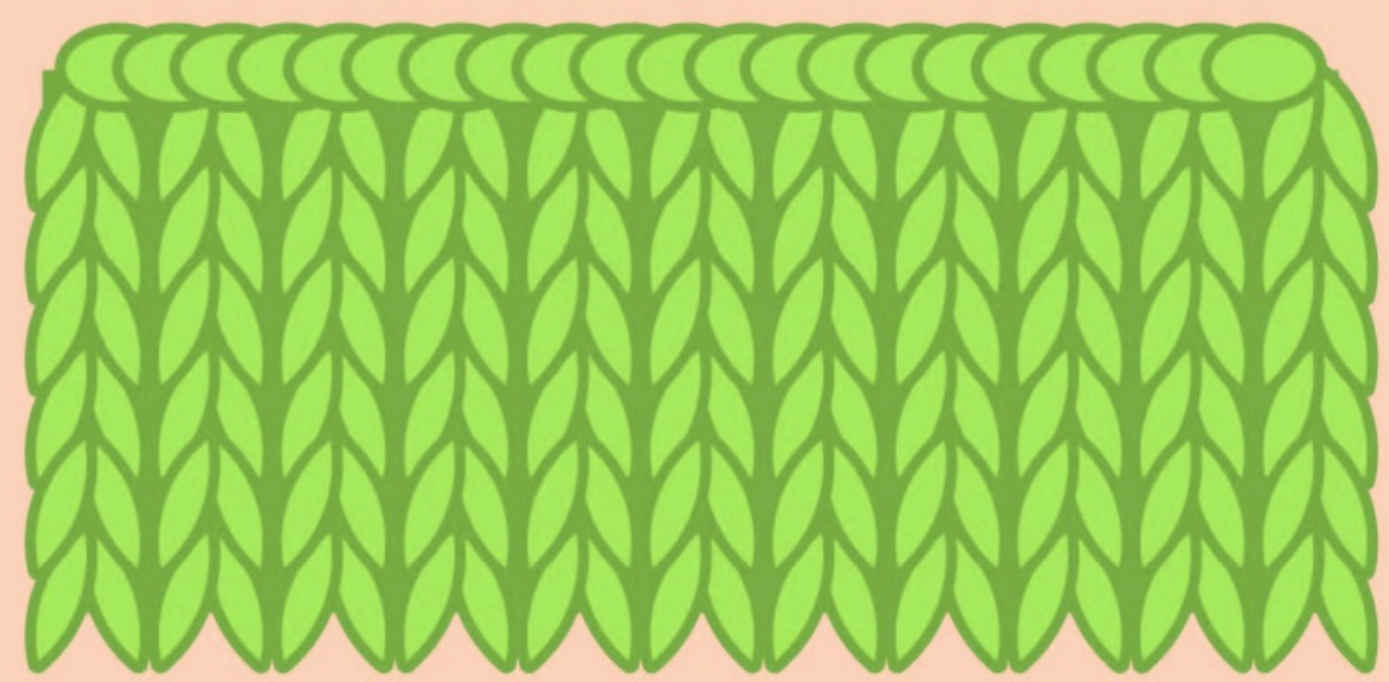


1-Cord Bind-Off

Makes a rounded, elastic edge.

Neat finish for pockets, hems, collars, etc.

Use instead of a crocheted edging.

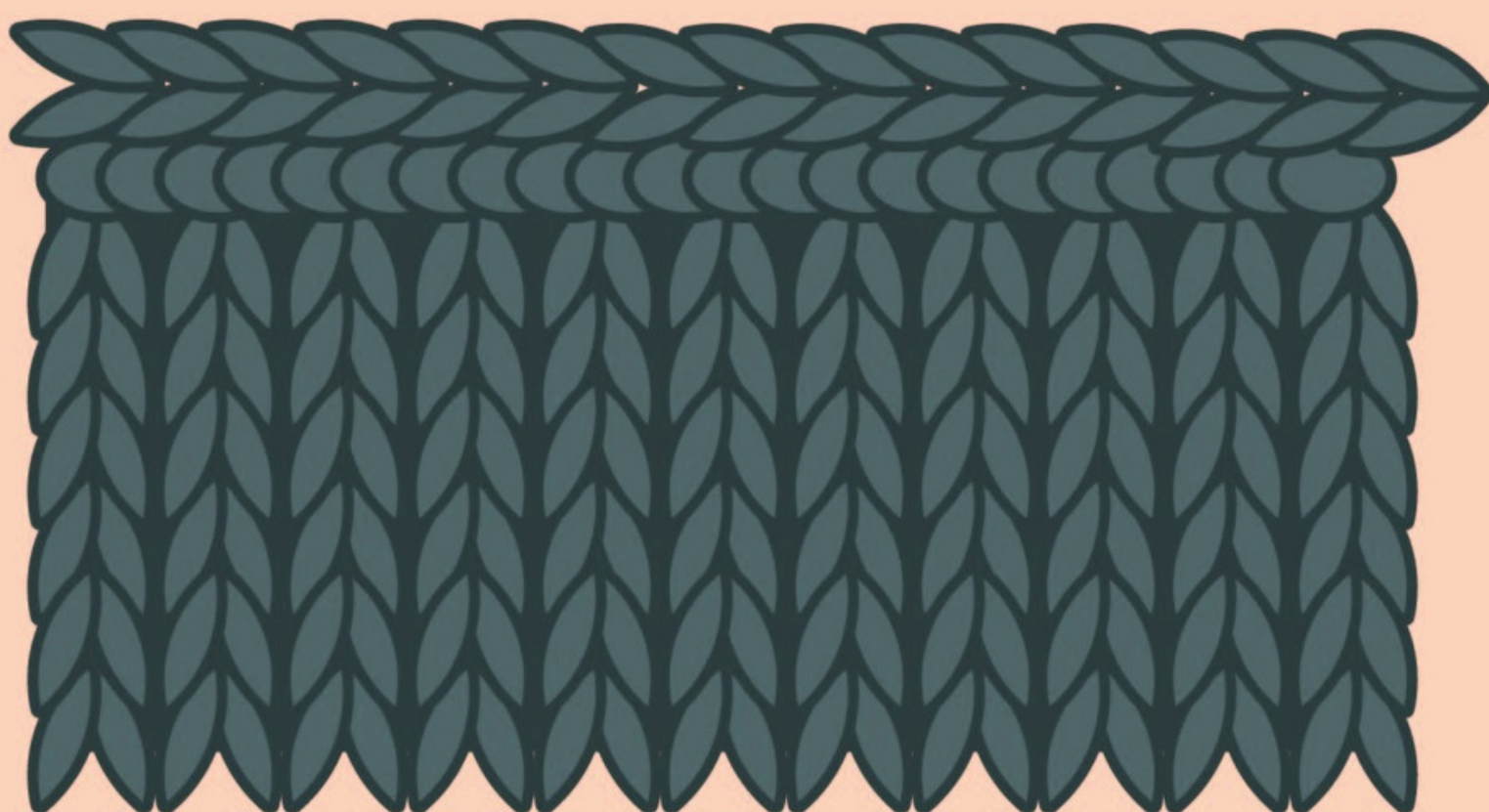


Long-Tail Cast-On

Most-used cast on.

Works for most patterns.

Firm, yet elastic edge.

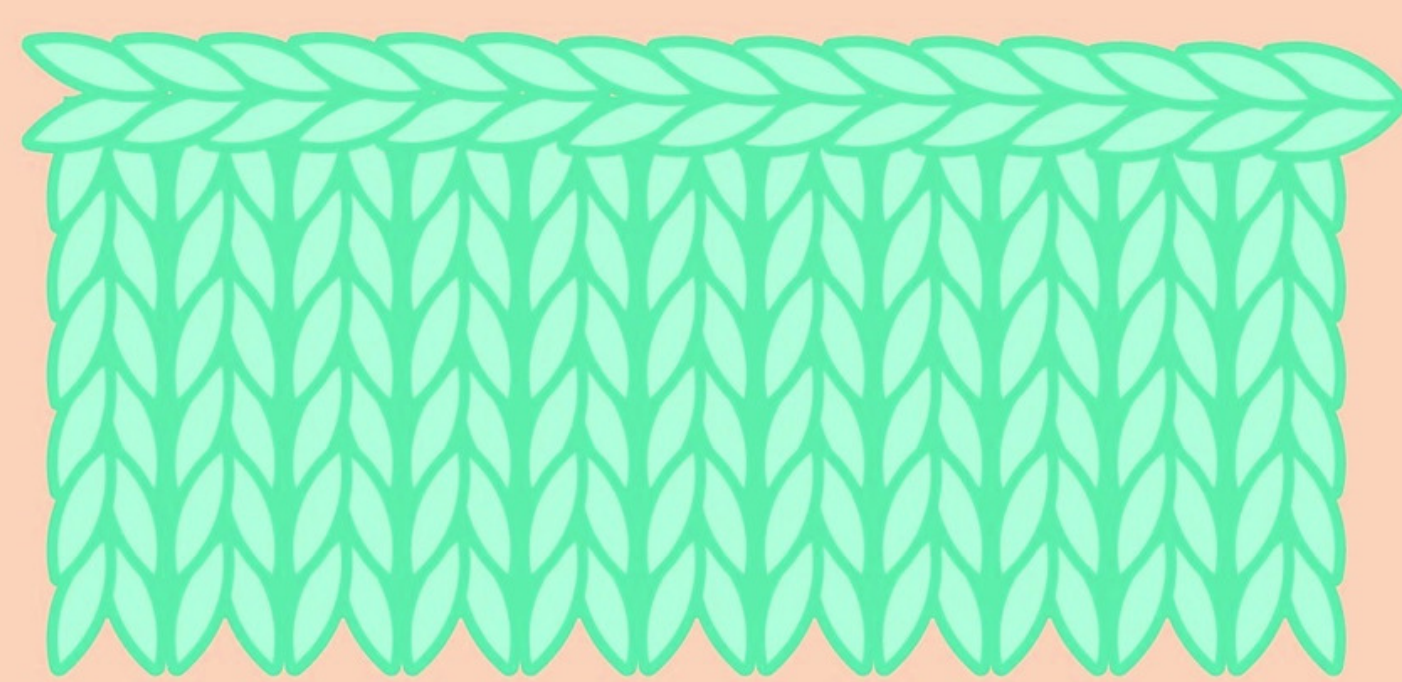


Suspended Bind-Off

Stretchier version of Standard Bind-Off.

Great for tight knitters.

Use for an elastic bind-off.

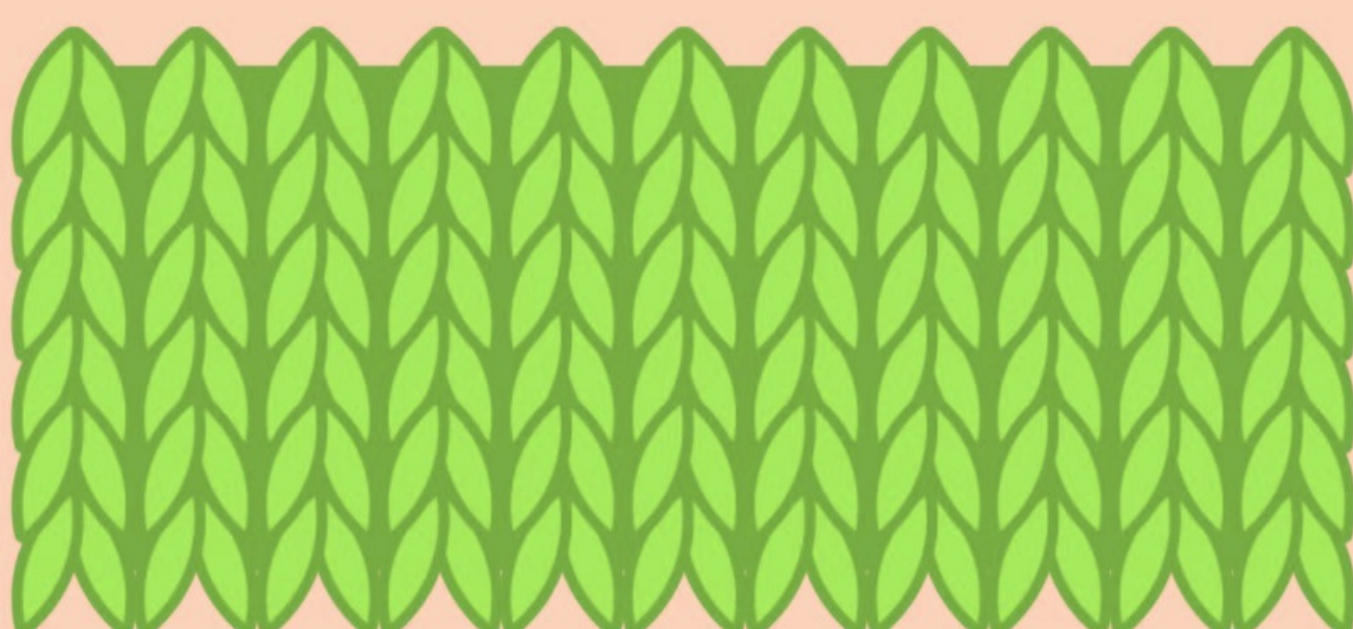


Old Norwegian Cast-On

Similar to Long-Tail Cast-On, but stretchier.

Great, all-purpose cast-on.

Makes a nice edge.

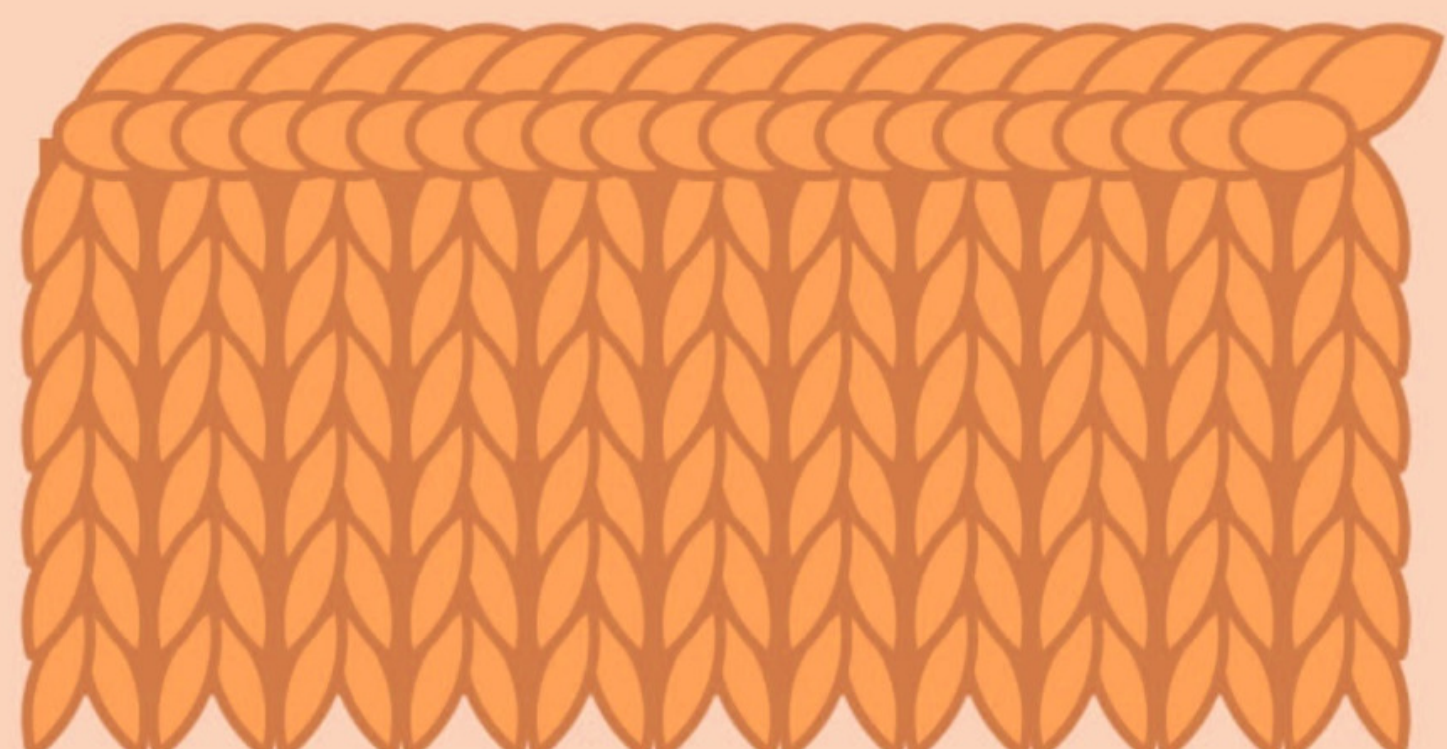


Tubular Bind-Off

Invisible bind-off that creates a round edge.

Great for hats and ribbing.

Very stretchy.



Crochet Chain Provisional Cast-On

A provisional cast-on: use to keep live stitches for later use.

Easy to work.

Yarn "zips" off when you're ready to work the held stitches.
